WHAT IS THE FREEDOM HOUSE RECOVERY PROGRAM?

Freedom House Inc. is a non-profit Christ-centered substance abuse recovery and rehabilitation program utilizing a combination of personal accountability studies and evidence-based behavior modification programs, recognized by SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP) and the Idaho Department of Corrections, in the context of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, in a safe, sober and welcoming environment. It is our hope that clients will leave Freedom House with lives radically changed through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, with the power to defeat the bondage of addiction, and with the potential to live the abundant life that God has intended.

Working with and supporting Bonner County Drug Court

Clients accepted into the Freedom House Substance Abuse Recovery and Rehabilitation Program will be typically, but not exclusively, men and women court-ordered to Freedom House as an alternative to incarceration, drug court or supervised probation. Consequently, close coordination between Freedom House leadership and local Probation and Parole officers will be maintained to ensure client accountability.

The Freedom House program is modeled after the highly successful Good Samaritan Recovery program in Coeur d'Alene Idaho, and has been developed with support and assistance from the Good Samaritan leadership team.



THE FREEDOM HOUSE JOURNEY

Early in 2016, a group of like-minded individuals formed a steering committee to develop a faith-based, substance abuse recovery program for Bonner and Boundary counties modeled after, and with strong support from, the aforementioned Good Samaritan Recovery program. During the summer of 2016, a Board of Directors and Executive Director were elected.



FHI provides "transitional housing" where clients can temporarily reside while re-establishing productive lives that include shared faith support, employment, educational activities, and reconnection with healthy family relationships.

FHI has enjoyed the start-up benefit of support and cooperation from the administrators of the very successful Good Samaritan program. While there has been some adaptation for the unique challenges of Bonner County, there is no need to "reinvent the wheel". This ongoing support is seen as a major asset in quickly achieving a success and avoiding unnecessary delays.
